we don t have to know what a painting is if we know how it makes us feel a fun fascinating survey of abstract art journeys to abstraction offers a behind the scenes look at how contemporary artists break free from literal depiction to rejoice in the pure expressive power of color line and texture 58 artists share 100 striking abstract paintings along with the ideas inspirations and diverse working processes behind them covers a wide variety of traditional and non traditional media and techniques including watercolor collage acrylics ink and more four step by step demonstrations show how abstract pieces come together from start to finish discover how artists paint pour scrape spray carve stamp collage and otherwise build complex layers of texture and meaning painting with egg cartons turning acrylic paints into shards of stained glass incorporating old failed paintings into fresh finished pieces anything goes in abstract art marked by an inspiring freedom of form and content this is a liberating book for any artist in search of new dynamic forms of self expression

abstract painting and abstraction can be a daunting and frustrating genre of art how should you approach a surface how can you use colour effectively how can you make better more expressive paintings this inspiring book answers these questions and many more through a thorough analysis of his own work emyr williams covers practical theoretical and historical issues of abstract art and explains a wide range of working methods to help develop more demanding personal approaches to the making of abstract painting he emphasizes the relationship of colour to surface and the importance of seeking a profound connection with your art

traditional art is based on conventions of resemblance between the work and that which it is a representation of abstract art in contrast either adopts alternative

modes of visual representation or reconfigures mimetic convention this book explores the relation of abstract art to nature taking nature in the broadest sense the world of recognisable objects creatures organisms processes and states of affairs abstract art takes many different forms but there are shared key structural features centered on two basic relations to nature the first abstracts from nature to give selected aspects of it a new and extremely unfamiliar appearance the second affirms a natural creativity that issues in new autonomous forms that are not constrained by mimetic conventions such creativity is often attributed to the power of the unconscious the book covers three categories classical modernism mondrian malevich kandinsky arp early american abstraction post war abstraction pollock still newman smithson noguchi arte povera michaux postmodern developments and the broader historical and philosophical scope

the beginner's guide to abstract art is an inspirational but practical book that will help artists to paint in a less figurative way laura reiter demonstrates different ways to approach an abstract painting from just a little bit abstract to completely abstract she does this by focussing on ideas and themes as starting points looking at the creative processes involved and more unusual techniques laura reiter also covers how to use materials creatively watercolour acrylics mixed media and collage and how to experiment with colour and composition there is also details on texture simple printing mark making colour and its meaning and sources of inspiration several projects are included and in addition to laura's vibrant colourful paintings the work of several other contemporary abstract artists is featured previously published in hardback as painting accessible abstracts

the seventeen essays in this provocative book provide a radical rethinking of abstraction from the symbolism that prefigured abstract art through the current manifestations of spiritual content in american and european painting

an exceptionally clear thorough and well illustrated introduction to abstract art since 1900 since the early years of the twentieth century western abstract art has fascinated outraged and bewildered audiences its path to acceptance within the artistic mainstream was slow this revised edition traces the origins and evolution of abstract art placing it in broad cultural context well respected scholar anna moszynska examines the pioneering work of hilma af klint wassily kandinsky kazimir malevich and piet mondrian alongside the russian constructivists the de stijl group and the bauhaus artists contrasting european geometric abstraction in the 1930s and 40s with the emphasis on personal expression after world war ii op kinetic and minimal art of the postwar period is discussed and illustrated in detail and new chapters bring the account up to date exploring the crisis in abstraction of the 1980s and its revival in paint fabric sculpture and installation in recent decades the first edition of abstract art published in 1990 was acclaimed by reviewers revised with extensive updates this book includes new chapters on recent trends and offers fully global coverage of art produced in north and south america europe china korea and the middle east now in full color and comprehensively revised it will serve as the best introduction to abstract art for a new generation

boldly developing the central traditions of american modernist abstraction lawrence carroll s paintings engage with a fundamental issue of aesthetic theory the nature of the medium of painting in highly original frequently extraordinarily successful ways aesthetic theory abstract art and lawrence carroll explains how he understands the medium of painting shows what his art says about the identity of painting as an art discusses the place of his paintings in the development of abstraction and finally offers an interpretation of his art the first monograph devoted to him this philosophical commentary employs the resources of analytic aesthetics art historians trace the development of art explaining how what came earlier yields to what comes later taking for granted that the artifacts they describe are artworks art historians place them within the history of art philosophical art writers define art explain why it has a history and identify its meaning pursuing that goal aesthetic theory abstract art and lawrence carroll roams freely across art history focused at some points on the story of old master painting and sometimes on the history of modernism but looking also to contemporary art in order to provide the fullest possible philosophical perspective on carroll s work

he delivered the lectures edited and reproduced here with their illustrations to overflowing crowds at the national gallery of art in washington in the spring of 2003 just months before his death with brilliance passion and humor varnedoe addresses the skeptical attitudes and misunderstandings that we often bring to our experience of abstract art resisting grand generalizations he makes a deliberate and scholarly case for abstraction showing us that more than just pure looking is necessary to understand the self made symbolic language of abstract art proceeding decade by decade he brings alive the history and biography that inform the art while also challenging the received wisdom about distinctions between abstraction and representation modernism and postmodernism and minimalism and pop

the author explains the dynamics of abstract art from its development over the years through present day 1964 touching on examples of surrealism expressionism and cubism he explains the use of negative and positive space thrust and pull of compositions and understanding the abstract alphabet when tackling your own canvasses he also touches on collage texture color mixed media and new techniques when painting like using pipe cleaners or cardboard cutouts instead of paintbrushes amazon

abstract paintings are discussed here both from the point of view of their creators and from the point of view of the spectator then the kind of question repeatedly asked about abstraction is asked and answered by what standards can an abstract painting be judged does abstraction set out to disregard the public s expectations and wishes if so is it unique in this does the viewer contribute more to an appreciation of an abstract painting than to a more traditional work does any abstract painting have a message if so how does it express it is it necessary to know anything about the artist himself in order to fully appreciate his

work does an abstract painting require more or less skill in its execution than a traditional work is there anything more to abstraction than novelty back cover

many people are intrigued by the abstract work of artists like mondrian and jackson pollock yet find it difficult to explain why in this timely and original book briony fer introduces abstract painting and sculpture of the twentieth century and explores new ways to think about abstract art and the problems of interpretation it raises fer speculates on the kind of language required to describe the often tantalizing effects of key abstract works and on ways to discuss critical issues when a work of art is without subject matter drawing particularly on psychoanalytic theory and the writings of georges bataille she examines a wide range of models of abstraction ranging from the early european emphasis on the transcendental possibilities of pure form to later modernist frameworks developed in the united states each of the ten chapters in the book addresses a particular problem associated with abstract art by focusing closely on specific works produced by such artists as malevich mondrian kandinsky arp miró pollock eva hesse and donald judd fer investigates the involvement of women artists such as lyubov popova and the problems of sexual difference in the development of abstract art countering the idealizing rhetoric of modernist criticism on abstract art uncovers a latent corporeal and darker side to abstraction and deepens today's discussion of a variety of critical concerns in contemporary art

petra thölken's practical and inspiring book examines what it means to make an abstract work of art she encourages the reader to consider the subjects of composition planes and subject and expression while also examining the more practical topics of colour theory and colour mixing how to work with pigment canvas and priming spatula techniques and working with unconventional backgrounds all these elements build up into a vocabulary of visual pointers from which the reader can begin to explore their own adventurousness and creativity through the 20 beautiful projects that petra demonstrates step by step readers will learn how to create texture work with unusual tools and create soft transitions or high contrast her clarity of thought and inspirational advice will open your eyes to a whole new way of seeing your paintings and achieving the self expression that leads to visually exciting and technically innovative work for some of the projects there are links to petra's popular youtube videos demonstrating how she created the individual paintings

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
